REGULATIONS

**PART I
INTERPRETATION**

1. (1) Chapter 1 of the Consolidated Statutes (Third Series) entitled "Of the Promulgation and Construction of Statutes" and amendments thereto shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as they apply to the interpretation of an Act.

(2) In these Regulations and in any amendments thereto, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

(a) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner for Public Utilities, or such other Commissioner as the Governor in Commission may from time to time appoint to administer these Regulations;

(b) "competent officer" means a member of the Newfoundland Constabulary or the Newfoundland Ranger Force;

(c) "deputy registrar" means a person appointed by the Commissioner under these Regulations to supervise the registration of persons in a registration district;

(d) "Newfoundland" includes Labrador;

(e) "Registrar" means the person appointed by the Governor in Commission to exercise under the Commissioner general direction and supervision over the registration of persons in Newfoundland;

(f) "registration district" means a division of Newfoundland made by the Commissioner under these Regulations for the purpose of registration of persons;

(g) "register" means a person who has registered or is registering pursuant to these Regulations;

(h) "registration period" means the period of days appointed under these Regulations for registration of persons.

**PART II
REGISTRATION**

2. The Governor in Commission may appoint a Registrar for Newfoundland who shall

(a) exercise under the Commissioner general direction and supervision over the administrative conduct of the registration of persons under these Regulations;

(b) issue to deputy registrars and other persons employed at or with respect to registration under these Regulations such instructions as from time to time he may deem necessary;

(c) execute and perform all other powers and duties which in these Regulations are imposed upon him.

3. The Governor in Commission may, by Proclamation, appoint a period of days for the registration hereinafter provided for and may appoint different periods for different registration districts.

4. (1) Every person residing permanently or temporarily in Newfoundland and being between the ages of sixteen and sixty-five, both inclusive, on the last day of the registration period for the registration district in which such person ordinarily resides shall register in the manner hereinafter prescribed:

Provided that the following persons shall not be required to register:—

(a) members of any naval, military or air force;

(b) persons not ordinarily resident in Newfoundland who are members of the crew of any ship temporarily in Newfoundland;

(c) inmates of any institutions excepted by the Commissioner upon recommendation of the Registrar.

(2) Every person being ordinarily resident in Newfoundland and being between the ages of sixteen and sixty-five years, both inclusive, who was absent from Newfoundland during the whole of the registration period for the registration district in which he resides and was not registered in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations, and every person residing permanently or temporarily in Newfoundland who

(a) attains his sixteenth birthday after the last day of the registration period for the registration district in which he resides, or

(b) being between the ages of sixteen and sixty-five years, both inclusive, ceases after the last day of the registration period for the registration district in which he resides to be a member of a class of persons exempted from registration under paragraph (1) of this Regulation, shall, within ten days from the date of his re-entry into Newfoundland or from the date of his ceasing to be exempted, as the case may be, attend before a competent officer and register in the manner prescribed in paragraph (1) of Regulation 8.

(3) Every person between the ages of sixteen and sixty-five years, both inclusive, being ordinarily resident in Newfoundland during or after the registration period for the registration district at which he enters shall within three days after entering Newfoundland attend before a competent officer and register in the manner prescribed in paragraph (1) of Regulation 8.

Provided that such subsequent registration shall not relieve such person from any penalty incurred for having failed to register during the registration period or within the time limited.

(5) Every person who is required by a deputy registrar under paragraph (2) of Regulation 8 to register another person and who refuses to do so may nevertheless at any time after such refusal and before the fifteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, attend before a competent officer and register such other person in the manner prescribed in paragraph (1) of Regulation 8.

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Provided that the following persons shall not be required to register:—

(a) members of any naval, military or air force;

(b) persons not ordinarily resident in Newfoundland who are members of the crew of any ship temporarily in Newfoundland;

(c) inmates of any institutions excepted by the Commissioner upon recommendation of the Registrar.

(2) Every person being ordinarily resident in Newfoundland and being between the ages of sixteen and sixty-five years, both inclusive, who was absent from Newfoundland during the whole of the registration period for the registration district in which he resides and was not registered in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations, and every person residing permanently or temporarily in Newfoundland who

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(3) Every person between the ages of sixteen and sixty-five years, both inclusive, being ordinarily resident in Newfoundland during or after the registration period for the registration district at which he enters shall within three days after entering Newfoundland attend before a competent officer and register in the manner prescribed in paragraph (1) of Regulation 8.

(4) Every person who refuses or fails to register as required by these Regulations may nevertheless at any time after such refusal or failure attend before a competent officer and register in the manner prescribed in paragraph (1) of Regulation 8.

Provided that such subsequent registration shall not relieve such person from any penalty incurred for having failed to register during the registration period or within the time limited.

(5) Every person who is required by a deputy registrar under paragraph (2) of Regulation 8 to register another person and who refuses to do so may nevertheless at any time after such refusal and before the fifteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, attend before a competent officer and register such other person in the manner prescribed in paragraph (1) of Regulation 8.

Provided that such subsequent registration shall not relieve such person from any penalty incurred for refusal to register such other person during the registration period.

5. The Commissioner shall divide Newfoundland into as many divisions as he may think proper:

Provided that the Commissioner may authorize the revision of the boundaries of any such division.

**PART IV
DEPUTY REGISTRARS.**

6. The Commissioner shall appoint persons to supervise the registration under these Regulations of persons ordinarily resident within registration districts.

7. Every deputy registrar shall, before entering on his duties, take and subscribe before a Justice of the Peace or other person authorized by law to administer oaths an oath of office in the form prescribed by the Registrar and shall forthwith cause the same to be returned to the Registrar.

**PART V
PROCEDURE ON REGISTRATION**

8. (1) Every person required by these Regulations to register during the registration period shall, when required to do so by a deputy registrar for the registration district in which such person ordinarily resides, register by truthfully declaring to such deputy registrar his answers to the question upon the appropriate registration card, and, after such answers have been written upon such

card, by signing the same in the presence of such deputy registrar and such signature shall be deemed to be an affirmation of the answers thereon recorded.

(2) If, by reason of illness or incapacity or absence from the place of ordinary residence of any person required by these Regulations to register, such person is unable to register in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this regulation, any other person above the age of fourteen years, being a member for the time being of the household of such person, and being required by a deputy registrar so to do, shall, on behalf of such person, declare the answers to the questions upon the appropriate registration card and shall sign the card and such signature shall be deemed to be an affirmation of the answers thereon recorded, and thereupon such person shall be deemed to have registered.

(3) If any person for whose registration provision is made by paragraphs (1) and (2) of this regulation shall remain unregistered on the fifteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, such person shall within ten days after that date attend before a competent officer and register in the manner prescribed in paragraph (1) of this regulation.

9. For the purposes of registration of persons required or permitted under paragraphs (2), (3), (4) and (5) of Regulation 4 and paragraph (3) of Regulation 8 to register, competent officers shall perform all the duties and functions of, and shall be deemed to be, deputy registrars under these Regulations.

(1) The deputy registrar shall issue to every registrant who has registration in the form prescribed by the Commissioner and approved by the Governor in Commission.

(2) In the case of a person registered under the provisions of paragraph (2) of Regulation 8, the Deputy Registrar shall deliver the certificate of registration to the person who has complied with the provisions of the said paragraph and such persons shall, within five days after receipt thereof, deliver or mail the said certificate to the registrant.

(3) If the certificate of registration of any person should be lost or destroyed, worn out or defaced, such person may, upon establishing the fact to the satisfaction of the Registrar, obtain from him a duplicate certificate.

11. Registration cards for men and women shall be in the form prescribed by the Commissioner and approved by the Governor in Commission.

12. Registration cards after completion thereof shall be delivered by deputy registrars to the Registrar, who shall hold custody of, file, preserve, classify and deal with the same and make available the information therein contained in the manner directed by the Commissioner.

(3) If any person for whose registration provision is made by paragraphs (1) and (2) of this regulation shall remain unregistered on the fifteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, such person shall within ten days after that date attend before a competent officer and register in the manner prescribed in paragraph (1) of this regulation.

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11. Registration cards for men and women shall be in the form prescribed by the Commissioner and approved by the Governor in Commission.

12. Registration cards after completion thereof shall be delivered by deputy registrars to the Registrar, who shall hold custody of, file, preserve, classify and deal with the same and make available the information therein contained in the manner directed by the Commissioner.

13. The Registrar, deputy registrars, competent officers and all other persons engaged in the registration custody or use of registration cards shall preserve secrecy as to all information disclosed by the cards and any such official, officer or other person who discloses, except as officially or by law required or as authorized by these Regulations or by the instructions of the Commissioner, any information so obtained shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

14. (1) Every person required by these Regulations to register during the registration period who, when required to do so by a deputy registrar in the registration district in which such person ordinarily resides, without lawful excuse refuses to register, and every person above the age of fourteen years required under the provisions of Regulation 8 (2) to register any other person, who without lawful excuse refuses to do so, and every person required by these Regulations to register before a competent officer who without lawful excuse fails to register in the manner hereinafter provided within the time limited therefor, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and in addition to any other penalty prescribed therefor by these Regulations shall be liable to a further penalty not exceeding five dollars for each day during which such refusal or failure continues.

(2) Any person to whom a certificate of registration has not been issued shall be deemed to be unregistered, and the burden of proving registration shall lie with the person who alleges it.

15. Any person may, at any time after the expiry of the registration period for the registration district in which such a person is, be stopped by a member of the Newfoundland Constabulary or the Newfoundland Ranger Force and questioned as to whether or not he is registered, and such person shall answer truthfully all relevant questions put to him concerning his registration and, if such person has been registered, he shall, if required by such member so to do, immediately or within such time as may be limited by such member produce for inspection his certificate of registration.

16. No person shall make any mark or entry upon or erase, cancel or alter any mark or entry made upon, or otherwise deface or destroy a certificate of registration:

Provided that this regulation shall not apply to anything done in pursuance of these Regulations or a direction given thereunder by the Commissioner and that anything so done shall not be deemed to be a defacement of a certificate of registration.

17. (1) If any person

(a) upon his registration refuses to answer any question on the appropriate registration card;

(b) upon his registration wilfully gives a false or misleading answer to any question on the appropriate registration card;

(c) refuses to sign his registration card;

(d) falsely represents himself to be a person to whom a certificate of registration has been issued;

he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(2) If any person required by a deputy registrar under paragraph (2) of Regulation 8 to declare, on behalf of another person, the answers to the questions on the appropriate registration card for such other person

(a) refuses to answer any question on the said registration card;

(b) refuses to sign the said registration card;

(c) wilfully gives a false or misleading answer to any question on the said registration card;

he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

18. Every person who without lawful reason or excuse, the proof of which lie upon him,

(a) has in his possession a certificate of registration or a document purporting to be a certificate of registration, which certificate or document was not lawfully issued to him pursuant to these Regulations, or a blank form of certificate of registration or printed paper purporting to be such blank form of certificate of registration;

(b) prints or makes a certificate of registration or any printed paper purporting to be blank form of certificate of registration; shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

19. Every person who counsels or advises any other person to refuse or omit to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations or who impedes or attempts to impede any person in the performance of his duty under these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

20. It shall be the duty of any person registered under these Regulations to answer truthfully in writing any questions which may be submitted to him in print or in writing by or under the direction of the Registrar touching the answers upon his registration card, or requiring further information concerning any of the matters therein mentioned or referred to, and to return his answers to any such questions to the Registrar, or to any other officer as may be required, either personally or by registered post, within ten days after the day when he shall have received the questionnaire; and every such person who refuses, fails or neglects, without lawful excuse, to return his answers to such questions within the time aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

21. Any person registered under these Regulations who afterwards marries or changes his place of residence shall within fourteen days notify the Registrar of the date of his marriage, and of the name and place of residence or the person whom he married, or of the place of residence and post office address to which he has removed, as the case may be, and any such person who refuses, fails or neglects, without lawful excuse, to comply with the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

22. For the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of these Regulations or supplying any deficiency therein, the Commissioner may issue such directions not inconsistent therewith as may be deemed necessary to give effect to these Regulations according to their true intent and purpose and any such direction shall have the same force and effect as if it formed part of these Regulations.

23. Every deputy registrar or other person charged with any duty under these Regulations who

(a) refuses, fails or neglects, without lawful excuse, to comply with these Regulations or any direction duly given by the Commissioner; or

(b) in the pretended performance of his duties hereunder shall obtain or seek to obtain information which he is not duly authorized to obtain; shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

24. Every person who shall falsely pretend to be a deputy registrar or other officer employed for the purpose of these Regulations and shall under such pretense ask or obtain from any person any information shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

25. (1) Every person, firm or Company employing other persons (hereinafter referred to as an "employer") shall on or before the fifteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, require each and every person in his employ who has attained his sixteenth birthday to produce for inspection his certificate of registration.

(2) Every employer shall on or after the fifteenth day of October aforesaid before employing any person who has attained his sixteenth birthday require such person to produce for inspection his certificate of registration.

(3) Every employer who on or after the fifteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, employs or continues in his employment any person required by these Regulations to register who is unregistered shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(4) On or before the twentieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, every employer shall report in writing to the Registrar and, in the case of an employer elsewhere that at St. John's, to the nearest Police officer or Ranger the name, address and occupation of all persons at any time employed by such employer required by these Regulations to register who are unregistered, and every employer who refuses, fails or neglects without lawful excuse to report as required by this regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(5) The Commissioner may exempt any employer from the provisions of this regulation any may postpone the date set forth in any or all paragraphs of this regulation in the case of any employer or may, by order, postpone any or all such dates in the case of all employers.

26. Subject to any exemptions which may be granted by or under the authority of the Commissioner, no person, firm or company having the management or control of any ship or aeroplane or acting as agent therefor, shall at any time after the expiration of the registration period for the registration district in which the port of departure of such ship or aeroplane is situate, sell to any person required by these Regulations to register a ticket to any place outside of Newfoundland or take on board such ship or aeroplane any person for transportation to any place outside of Newfoundland unless the person seeking such ticket or transportation shall first have produced a certificate of registration.

27. (1) Every person who shall commit an offence against or shall contravene or fail to comply with these Regulations or any amendment thereto shall be liable upon summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars or, in default of payment, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months.

(2) The provisions of this regulation shall, in so far as the same shall be applicable thereto, apply to bodies corporate.

28. Any fine imposed and recovered for any offence under these Regulations shall be paid into the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

29. (1) The Commissioner, with the concurrence of the Commissioner for Finance, shall have power to prescribe the remuneration or allowance to the persons (not being Civil Servants) employed in the execution of these Regulations, which may be a fixed sum, a rate per diem or a scale of fees together with an allowance for expenses.

(2) Such remuneration or allowances and all expenses incurred in carrying these Regulations into effect shall be paid out of such moneys as are voted by the Commission of Government for that purpose.

30. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (National Registration) Regulations, 1942.

Sale of Turnips

The attention of the public is drawn to the fact that, as an from September 1st, 1942, under Regulation 7 of the Fishery and Agricultural Produce (Grading and Marking) (Turnip) Regulations 1940, no person shall sell or offer for sale for human consumption any turnips of inferior quality to that designated as No. 1 in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

Any persons wishing to obtain copies of the Turnip Regulations should apply to the Department of Natural Resources.

24. Every person who shall falsely pretend to be a deputy registrar or other officer employed for the purpose of these Regulations and shall under such pretense ask or obtain from any person any information shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

25. (1) Every person, firm or Company employing other persons (hereinafter referred to as an "employer") shall on or before the fifteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, require each and every person in his employ who has attained his sixteenth birthday to produce for inspection his certificate of registration.

(2) Every employer shall on or after the fifteenth day of October aforesaid before employing any person who has attained his sixteenth birthday require such person to produce for inspection his certificate of registration.

(3) Every employer who on or after the fifteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, employs or continues in his employment any person required by these Regulations to register who is unregistered shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(4) On or before the twentieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, every employer shall report in writing to the Registrar and, in the case of an employer elsewhere that at St. John's, to the nearest Police officer or Ranger the name, address and occupation of all persons at any time employed by such employer required by these Regulations to register who are unregistered, and every employer who refuses, fails or neglects without lawful excuse to report as required by this regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(5) The Commissioner may exempt any employer from the provisions of this regulation any may postpone the date set forth in any or all paragraphs of this regulation in the case of any employer or may, by order, postpone any or all such dates in the case of all employers.

26. Subject to any exemptions which may be granted by or under the authority of the Commissioner, no person, firm or company having the management or control of any ship or aeroplane or acting as agent therefor, shall at any time after the expiration of the registration period for the registration district in which the port of departure of such ship or aeroplane is situate, sell to any person required by these Regulations to register a ticket to any place outside of Newfoundland or take on board such ship or aeroplane any person for transportation to any place outside of Newfoundland unless the person seeking such ticket or transportation shall first have produced a certificate of registration.

27. (2) The provisions of this regulation shall, in so far as the same shall be applicable thereto, apply to bodies corporate.

29. BOARD OF LIQUOR CONTROL

The Commission of Government have had under consideration the effect of the restriction as from the 10th August last of the sales of rum, whisky, brandy and other spirits to three bottles per week.

In the light of the experience gained, and having regard to difficulties experienced in maintaining stocks, it has been decided further to restrict consumption, and as from the opening of business on the 31st August, no person may purchase more than two bottles of spirits in any one week. The necessary changes in the existing Regulations to give effect to this decision are published below.
