Report on MONTHLY CONDITIONS - SEPTEMBER, 1945.

Headquarters

Sir:-

1. I have the honour to report with reference to the conditions existing in this Detachment District during the month of September, 1945.

2. Those who were employed for the past few months in prosecuting the fishery, have now returned from their "fishing places" and have taken up residence here at Nain. They are now working here at the fish and are getting it ready for shipment. The total catch this season was approximately three thousand quintals; giving an average of fifty quintals or four hundred dollars to each of the sixty fishermen.

3. The Indians have now gone inland, and in due time they should have a good catch of fur.

4. Assistance issued during the past month amounted to \$541.72 (Five hundred forty one dollars, seventy two cents) Made up as follows:-

Issued to sick persons and widows.....\$43.48
Issued to Indians.....\$498.24

There were four errors in the June, July and August accounts, amounting to \$12.09. This was due to the fact that new prices on various commodities had not been received.

5. With the exception of a few chronic sufferers, the health of the villiagers has been fairly good.

6. On the whole the weather has been fairly good. We have had a little rain and it has been very windy throughout.
