## Headquarters

Sir:-

1. I have the honour to submit the following report upon conditions generally in the BAY L'ARGENT district during the six months ending June 1943.

2. FISHERIES:

In this district fishing was the main industry and the one on which the people dependent for a livelihood, but since the commencement of construction work and the great demand for labour at the defence bases and elsewhere the codfishery statistics throughout this district have dropped somewhat in the past two years. Many fishermen, who were prior to the start of construction work engaged at the fishery, have now found employment with high earnings at the defence bases. The shore fishery which is prosecuted by a small number of fishermen this year, is up to the present very encouraging and some large catches have been secured both in codnets and codtraps. Three small fishing vessels from this district are operating this year at SYDNEY in the fresh fishing industry out of that port. From reports received by the owners, high earnings will be realized this year by men engaged at this branch of the fishery. No banking schooners are operating from the district this year, but many fishermen have joined banking vessels out of BELLEORAM and GRAND BANK for the seasons' fishery, prospects of which are very encouraging to-date. With the present demand and high prices for codfish this year, the earnings of fishermen both at the bank and shore fishery will no doubt exceed previous years.

3. HERRING.

The herring fishery closed on May 15th. and all packers secured sufficient to fill all packing barrels on hand. This years' herring fishery was a successful one, due to the high price and great demand for herring throughout the season. Prices paid fishermen this year were higher than former years and averaged from \$2.40 to \$2.50 per barrel, while 25¢ to 30¢ per hour was paid for labour. The total number of barrels packed and exported at the close of the season was 7278, and were made up as follows:

5. PUBLIC WORKS.

During the years of ablebodied relief the secondary roads and bridges throughout this district were kept in repairs by relief work. Since no relief work was performed during the past 2½ years and no public monies expended, the condition of most of the roads and bridges are now showing signs of neglect, and in some communities immediate repairs are necessary, particularly to many bridges. Work on the TERRENCEVILLE / GOOBIES highroad in building a number of concrete bridges to replace the present wooden ones is to be undertaken shortly it is reported.

6. EMPLOYMENT.

Reports as to the employment situation for the future are still encouraging. With the majority of the ablebodied men employed at the defence bases, others engaged at the fishery; very few men from this district are now home, and those are at present engaged at the local fishing industry. During the past six months high earnings were realized both by those who were constantly employed at the bases, and by fishermen who returned home to prosecute the local herring fishery.

7. CRIME.

There were 6 (six) cases disposed off during the period under review. Two for larceny, one for disorderly conduct on the public street, one for a breach of the game laws, one bastardy and one for obtaining money by false pretenses. Convictions were obtained in all six cases. The outstanding cases at this Detachment consists of: Eleven larceny cases, one breach of price control, one disorderly conduct case, and one bigamy case. Those cases will be brought to the attention of the Magistrate on his next visit here.

8. RELIEF.

No ablebodied was issued during the past six months. Sick-Poor was issued on an average per month of \$320.00. The following will show expenditure for relief for the past six months as compared with the previous six months of 1942.

The increase during the past six months was due mainly to an increase of 50¢ per ration which commenced in January of this year.


11. CONCLUSION.
